CHRISTMAS DINNER

Wednesday 13 December: Years 5 and 6 / Thursday 14 December: Years 3 and 4

Traditional Roast Turkey with Festive Trimmings and Gravy (G, SU) or Roast Vegetable Wellington with a Tomato Sauce (E, G)
Rustic Roast Potatoes, Peas, Carrots and Brussel Sprouts
Chocolate Yule Log with Vanilla Cream (MK, E, G) or Fruit Pot

If your child usually has school meals and you have already booked meals for this half term you do not need to take any action.

If your child has school meals and you book the meals weekly, if you wish your child to have the Christmas meal then you should book **by Wednesday 22 November.**

If your child usually has a packed lunch and you would like them to join in with the Christmas dinner then you should book **by Wednesday 22 November.**

Children will be asked to make their meal choice after this date, if you have not booked your child's meal by this date then Olive Dining are unable to guarantee a Christmas Dinner on the day.

Years 3 and 4 will be offered pasta bake on Wednesday 13 December and Years 5 and 6 will be offered pasta bake on Thursday 14 December.

Year 4 Swimming: Focus of the week:

- Group 1 Independent front crawl and water safety Group 2 - Float on back for 30 seconds, demonstrate a log roll
- Group 3 Demonstrate recognisable arm action for front and back crawl
- Group 4 Swim at the bottom of the pool for at least 5m water safety
- Group 5 –Perform a dive with a suitable streamline position and race start and a race turn.

Unauthorised Absence from School

Just to remind parents/carers that if you take your child/ren out of school without authority for five or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), you will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices. Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.

The next SEND Meeting for parents will be on Tuesday 21 November at 2pm. We have invited Leigh Moir, an Occupational Therapist, to share information about the Senses. Leigh will provide advice and strategies to support Sensory Needs and Sensory Regulation.
