) DYSLEXIA CORNER - RELUCTANT READERS

Children with dyslexia are often reluctant to read. When you consider a dyslexic person's cognitive profile, it's easy to understand why. Working memory weakness makes it harder to remember details in stories. Limited phonological awareness and a slower processing speed makes it tricky to decode unfamiliar words.
