### Forest School - by Ms Webber, Whittle & Spark

After a blustery stormy night Eden class went out for their final session of forest school with Whittle & Spark. This time we went to an area of the school grounds which most of the children had never visited before. The far meadow. It was exciting to discover a whole new area of the school. A second field beyond our sports field. We examined the small meadow area and saw that flowers had grown in the longer grass next to the baby trees. We could see the old flower and seed heads. We all helped to carry the kit in a trolley. We had everything we needed to make ourselves hot chocolate as well as a giant bundle of fresh green willow stems, games, tools and



a mobile shelter tent. We weren't allowed under the big trees around the field because of last night's storm. Our job was to plant the willow in boggy ground to make a miniature village of willow houses. We learnt to plant and weave the willow in special ways and had to work as a team to get everything done. It looked lovely at the end, like an ancient stone-age settlement. We made up some games and we learnt a great new game on the way back to school. Some of the willow we planted is meant to grow and most of the stems we woven are meant to hold the mini houses in place.

#### **Unauthorised Absence from School**

Just to remind parents/carers that if you take your child/ren out of school without authority for five or more days (which do not have to be consecutive),

you will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to

£120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices. Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.

• **Creativity in approach** – Innovative angle on the content or creative interpretation of the theme – don't be afraid to think outside the box


- Content Clear, accurate and informative about a STEM topic

What are the prizes? Prizes for the 2023 competition winners included:


