#### **International Day**

Year 5 really enjoyed the International Day activities that awaited them this week. They learned about some of the Asian countries: South Korea, Japan and Russia. When in Japan, the children learned about the beauty of sakura trees, tasted some seaweed and listened to a Japanese version of We Will Rock You. They had a go at a Sudoku challenge and some even got a chance to learn some origami. In South Korea, the children enjoyed some k-pop, tried some milk bread and then played a traditional Korean board game called Yut Nori. Finally, in Russia, they practiced using the Russian alphabet and learned about Matryoshka (nesting dolls). For every country they visited, they collected a stamp for their passport.

Additionally, the children enjoyed the French theatre production 'Chasse au Tresor', finding it funny and engaging. They also wrote a postcard and explored their countries further using DigiMaps. We would like to say a huge thank you to all our parent belows and staff who shared their eventiones or read a start in their mether language.

helpers and staff who shared their experiences or read a story in their mother language, for instance German, Slovak, Czech, Italian and French. The children also loved learning about the art of rangoli from India, and also understanding what life is like in South Africa.

Year 6 spent the day researching about countries from the continent; Ocenaia. In Snowdon Class the children looked at Australia, in Windermere they studied New Zealand and in Aviemore the children researched Tonga, Samoa and Fiji. The

children were put into groups of 3 or 4 and moved from classroom to classroom. As groups they produced an A2 poster which incorporated information about all five countries. Overall, the children had a very enjoyable day.

The fun week was concluded by EAL children giving an assembly presented by Mrs Law (EAL lead).

#### Forest Schools

Nightingale have been enjoying forest school with Whittle & Spark. They could not go under the trees in the woodland for their first forest school because the wind was blowing so strongly. They set up a new mud kitchen and helped in the garden. Then they went to the pond where they saw a lot of different water animals. They fished with a net to find more small creatures. They discovered how the water animals breathe and move. The largest animal they found was a great diving beetle which carries a bubble of air under its wing cases. They used magnifying glasses to examine the smallest creatures. They were quiet and calm around the water and the animals.

On their second forest school it was a rainy day so they had a giant blue tent to shelter under. They were allowed to explore the woodland again and they made and used their own maps. Then they read each others maps to find their way around the woodland. They sat in the fire circle and used magnesium rods and steel strikers to make sparks and light mini fires. The sun came out in the afternoon so they took down the giant tent and helped fold it up.

#### **Unauthorised Absence from School**

Just to remind parents/carers that if you take your child/ren out of school without authority for five or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), you will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a

prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices. Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.
