WBJS Science week This year, we have been really fortunate to have Dr Richard Metcalfe, Unity Trust Outreach, to come and help us deliver some great challenges connected to this year's topic of Time. Year 5 and 6 children were challenged in making foam rollercoaster clocks which the children had to calibrate to exactly five seconds. The children showed great team effort and precision skills. At the end of the challenge, two teams joined together - creating one massive roller coaster ride. Thorpe park, brace yourself, we have some budding engineers in the making. Year 3 and 4 children were enticed in calibrating pendulums and building and testing water clocks. Once again, the Year 3 team are incredibly proud of the level of attention to detail in planning, making and presenting their EXPO projects. Their enthusiasm and curiosity about the Science we have been learning this week has shone through, which has continued with our enquiry lessons, thanks to Dr Metcalfe. Year 5 EXPO - children really surprised us with their amazing scientific concepts this year as well as their confidence in presenting these to others. Big thank you to our amazing parents who took time to come and see these concepts and help their children with the selection and build. We very much hope you had some great conversations around the science at home. To join Art and Science, the children were tasked to create a 3D model or collage of a scientific concept using their gained skills of Art and DT. We enjoyed the assembly hosted by Mr. Campbell, who talked about his work as a BA pilot and brought the concept of time zones and time in general into the perspective of his daily job. There were many questions from the children showing great interest in the topic presented. Year 5 concluded their science week of activities by spending time outside cloud spotting and making barometers in their classrooms.

Unauthorised Absence from School

Just to remind parents/carers that if you take your child/ren out of school without authority for five or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), you will be liable to receive a penalty notice.

Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice is £60.00 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to £120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer per child so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices. Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.
