- On certain weeks you will be asked to complete one task from the grid below.
- Please colour and date the sections and sign them after each one of the tasks has been completed.
- All homework tasks to be completed in homework books. It may be that some tasks may be shown through photographs or an explanation in your homework book.

Complete the Ancient Egypt reading comprehension. There is a Bronze, Silver and Gold choice so you can choose. Please write the answers as full sentences in your book OR print the sheet out and stick in.	Go out on a walk. Can you find any evidence of an animal? Create a food chain including that animal. Draw it out in your homework book and label it with producer, prey, predator	Read a book or some information about an area of Ancient Egypt, eg clothing, food, children. Write some brief notes on what you found out.	Choose a maths area you know you need to work on (eg times tables, division methods etc) Create yourself a 'practise poster' with tips and examples on it to help you.
Make a wordsearch with your spelling words. You can do this on a web programme if you want to. Find all the words and highlight them.	Find a piece of artwork you like and replicate it using collage. Eg Monet, Van Gogh, Picasso https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ppBdlj2pEUc	Find a recipe that you like the look of. Make it with someone at home. Remember to include photos!	Complete the Grammar task – 'Correcting Sentences'. When you have finished you can check and mark your own as the answers are there too. Use the answer sheet to mark your own when you are done. Correct anything in green.
Complete the Grammar task – 'Inverted Commas'. Write the sentences out in your homework book. Use the answer sheet to mark your own when you are done. Correct anything in green.	Make a quiz about an area of our 'Ancient Egypt' topic. Write your questions out carefully and make sure you have researched the answers so we can use it in class! Aim for about 10 questions.	Maths – Times Tables Use the internet to find some different ways of practising your times tables. Record the best ones in your homework book and explain why they helped you.	Maths Mystery Choose one of the investigation tasks. Using your maths skills, solve each clue to eliminate the suspects until you have found the true one!
