

Year 3 Assessment Objectives:

- Children can locate West Byfleet and name surrounding towns, cities and counties as well as the major capital cities of the UK – London, Edinburgh, Belfast and Cardiff.
- Children can explain the physical and human features of a seaside town and name/locate our closest ones e.g. Brighton, West Wittering and Littlehampton.
- Children can identify some features of a coastline (arches, stacks, caves, sand dunes) and explain the effect of erosion.
- Children can explain and name the six different biomes and try to give some examples of each (tundra, woodlands, savannah, grasslands, deserts and rainforests).
- Children can use 4 compass points to give directions.
- Children can present information on a map using a simple key.

Year 4 Assessment Objectives:

- Children can locate the Arctic Circle, Polar Regions and Europe on a map and name some European countries, particularly Norway, Denmark and Sweden.
- Children can explain the physical and human similarities and differences between the Scandinavian countries and the UK.
- Children can locate the Basingstoke Canal and understand the purpose and features of a canal (e.g. dams, locks, aqueducts, bridges).
- Children can identify some features of rivers and how it is formed (e.g. mouth, source, meander, bank, oxbow lake) and locate major rivers in the UK (River Thames) and around the world (River Nile)
- Children can recognise OS map symbols.
- Children can analyse and draw conclusions by making comparisons between locations.

Year 5 Assessment Objectives:

- Children can explain how the needs of a population are met by the local and regional area and list examples.
- Children can name and locate the UKs highest mountains and some of the seven summits (Mount Everest, Aconcagua, Denali, Kilimanjaro, Mount Elbrus, Mount Vinson and Carstensz Pyramid).
- Children can explain how, where and why volcanoes and earthquakes are formed and occur (Ring of fire).
- Children can name and locate some rainforests (near equator/ between tropic of Cancer and Capricorn) and explain the different layers, the benefits of them and the threats they are facing.
- Children can draw maps and use a scale to estimate distances.
- Children can understand what contour lines on maps show us.

Year 6 Assessment Objectives:

- Children can explain trade, global supply chain, ethical trading and compare what countries import and export (including UK).
- Children can use lines of longitude and latitude and understand time zones.
- Children can locate countries in North and South America and understand and compare the key physical and human features and landmarks within them.
- Children know what the features of the coasts are (Year 3 vocab + bays, headlands and stumps) and can name some coast management strategies and the effect humans and climate change has on the environment.

- Children can use 6 figure grid references.
- Children can present information using graphs.
