Key indicator 1: The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – Chief Medical Officer Guidelines recommend that primary school children undertake at least 30 minutes of physical activity a day in school.

- providing targeted activities or support to involve and encourage the least active children
- encouraging active play during break times and lunchtimes
- establishing, extending or funding attendance of school sports clubs and activities and holiday clubs, or broadening the variety offered
- adopting an active mile initiative
- raising attainment in primary school swimming to meet requirements of the national curriculum before the end of key stage 2 - every child should leave primary school able to swim

Focus	Planned actions to achieve	Expense (Approx)	Impact
<i>Playtime Sports Equipment</i>	To purchase new sporting equipment for children to engage with at play times. This should ensure that the children are staying active and going beyond the required 30 minutes of physical activity a day.	£3500	Children will have access to a variety of high-quality sports equipment, encouraging them to be more active during playtimes. This will help improve physical fitness, develop teamwork and coordination skills, and support overall wellbeing by ensuring they consistently exceed the recommended 30 minutes of daily activity.

Key indicator 2: The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.

For Example:

- actively encourage pupils to take on leadership or volunteer roles that support the delivery of sport and physical activity within the school (such as 'sports leader' or peer-mentoring schemes).
- embedding physical activity into the school day through encouraging active travel to and from school, active break times and holding active lessons and teaching

Focus	Planned actions to achieve	Expense (Approx)	Impact
<i>Sports Crew Training</i>	Y6 pupils attending Sports crew training to take up sports leadership in the new year (2024)	£225	Year 6 pupils will develop leadership, communication, and organisational skills through sports crew training. They will be equipped to lead activities for younger children, promote positive play, and act as role models, increasing whole-school participation in physical activity and fostering a culture of teamwork and responsibility

Key indicator 3: Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport

For Example:

- providing staff with professional development, mentoring, appropriate training and resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively to all pupils, and embed physical activity across your school
- hiring qualified sports coaches and PE specialists to work alongside teachers to enhance or extend current opportunities offered to pupils - teachers should learn from coaches the necessary skills to be able to teach these new sports and physical activities effectively

Focus	Planned actions to achieve	Expense (Approx)	Impact
<i>Attend Active Surrey Sports Conference</i>	Gather knowledge and ideas from conference to enhance the effectiveness of P.E and sport in school	£250	Staff will gain up-to-date knowledge, strategies, and resources to improve the delivery of P.E. and sport across the school. This will enhance the quality of teaching, broaden the range of activities offered, and ultimately increase pupil engagement, enjoyment, and attainment in physical education
<i>LSA/Lunch time staff Physifun training</i>	CPD for LSAs and LTS to broaden knowledge of active games to engage at play times. This will be an on-site course run by Active Surrey	£310	LSAs and lunchtime staff will gain the skills and confidence to lead a wider variety of active games during playtimes. This will increase pupil participation, reduce inactivity, promote positive behaviour, and create more inclusive opportunities for all children to be active and engaged.

Key indicator 4: Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.

For Example:

- introducing a new range of sports and physical activities to encourage more pupils to take up sport and physical activities
- partnering with other schools to run sports and physical activities and clubs
- providing more and broadening the variety of extra-curricular physical activities after school in the 3 to 6pm window, delivered by the school or other local sports organisations

Focus	Planned actions to achieve	Expense (Approx)	Impact
<i>New Equipment Order</i>	New Footballs for coaching: Size 3 and 4	£68	Providing appropriately sized footballs will improve the quality of coaching sessions, ensuring children can develop age-appropriate skills more effectively. This will boost confidence, enjoyment, and participation in football, while also supporting teamwork, coordination, and physical fitness.
<i>Sports Day Equipment</i>	New resources for cricket and rounders for sports day 2025	£350	New cricket and rounders equipment will enhance the quality and enjoyment of Sports Day, allowing all pupils to participate safely and effectively. This will promote teamwork, sportsmanship, and active engagement, creating a memorable and inclusive event that encourages lifelong participation in physical activity.

Key indicator 5: Increased participation in competitive sport

For Example:

- increasing and actively encouraging pupils' participation in the School Games
- organising more sport competitions or tournaments within the school
- coordinating and entering more sport competitions or tournaments across the local area, including those run by sporting organisations

Focus	Planned actions to achieve	Expense (Approx)	Impact
<i>Re-join WASPs</i>	Renew subscription to WASPs partnership	£750	Renewing the WASPs partnership will provide continued access to a wide range of sporting events, competitions, and resources. This will enhance pupil engagement in physical activity, offer opportunities to develop skills and confidence, and foster a sense of community and teamwork through participation in inter-school sports.
<i>Sports Hall Athletics</i>	Enter event for 2024	£75	Entering the Sports Hall Athletics event will give pupils the opportunity to compete in a structured, motivating environment. This will help develop their athletic skills, boost confidence, encourage healthy competition, and foster teamwork and school pride.
<i>Cricket Tournament Fees</i>	Surrey Schools Cricket Asso fee to join schools competitions in Summer term	£25	Paying the Surrey Schools Cricket Association fee will allow pupils to participate in competitive cricket tournaments. This provides opportunities to develop cricket skills, experience teamwork and sportsmanship, and build confidence through representing the school in a structured sporting environment.
<i>Supply Teacher Fees</i>	Amount used to cover teachers if they need to attend a sporting event.	£2500 (approx)	Funding supply teacher cover ensures that staff can attend sporting events without disrupting classroom learning. This allows pupils to benefit from participation in competitions and extracurricular activities, promoting physical activity, teamwork, and school representation while maintaining continuity in teaching for other classes.
<i>New Football Goals</i>	New football goals (x4) needed for field in order to replace previous goals and to ensure league participation at school. Goals needed to ensure football is taught effectively during P.E sessions and to increase engagement for all genders across the school	£3500	New football goals will enable safe and effective football coaching during P.E. sessions and support participation in school leagues. This will increase pupil engagement across all genders, improve skill development, promote teamwork, and foster a positive attitude toward regular physical activity.
