

## Geography: Google Earth - Country comparison

https://www.google.co.uk/intl/en\_uk/earth/

Choose a country you've always liked or been interested in or even been to. Using Google Earth, compare this country to the UK in terms of their geographical landscapes. You could compare coastlines, weather, cities, roads, mountain ranges, green areas, measure country size and so on.

Google Earth gives you tools in the settings bar on the left hand side of the page (marked red) to explore your chosen country along with the UK.

You also select the information tab on the right hand side of the page (marked yellow) to expand. This will then give you statistical information about your chosen country.



Below is a suggested format (table) for you to use to compare both countries. You can either use this or come up with your own template to use.
